with higher education s refocus over the last three decades on bringing greater recognition and reward to good teaching the idea of peer review has gained popularity one tool for documenting and reflecting on the quality of teaching and student learning is a course portfolio a course portfolio captures and makes visible the careful difficult and intentional scholarly work of planning and teaching a course illustrated through examples of course portfolios created during a four year project on peer review of teaching this book demonstrates how faculty can integrate well designed peer review into their daily professional lives thus improving their teaching by incorporating a means for assessment and collaboration and revealing the student learning that happens with effective teaching within an institutional reward systems this book offers a model of peer review intended to help faculty document assess reflect on and improve teaching and student learning through the use of a course portfolio it features a rich collection of materials including four dozen exhibits to help assemble a portfolio reviewers comments and reflections drawn from more than 200 professors and portfolio authors in various disciplines and institutions that faculty can use to develop their course portfolios to be used in their peer review of teaching

in their carefully constructed and detailed account schiefelbein and mcginn suggest that if latin america is to catch up with the rest of the world a broader view of education and particularly teaching is required this book includes a close examination of learning and teaching in the classroom the administration of schools and school districts the management of systems of education in ministries and the political processes that generate educational policy and law and consensus the authors base their arguments on what research tells us and they

dismiss a great number of time honoured truths that have no basis in fact in a jargon free and readable style the authors propose five major strategies for a radical improvement in the quality of teaching and learning in latin america greater emphasis on learning how to learn converting teachers from producers of learning to managers of learning fundamental improvements in teacher training shifting the emphasis for change from the central to the local level emphasizing learning that will lead to increased freedom for all although focused on latin america a great deal of the authors recommendations is applicable to other regions of the world

the cultural historical approach started in the 1930s by lev vygotsky who held that learning and instruction are the means to development is the foundation for the radical local theory of teaching and learning formulated by mariane hedegaard and seth chaiklin in the first part of the book the central concern in this approach to education is how to integrate particular historical and cultural conditions that the children encounter into educational practices the second half of the book is an extensive case study of an after school programme for puerto rican primary students in east harlem new york conducted in a radical local perspective this programme focussed on the history of the community and of puerto rican immigration and the study describes how it helped students become both more positive and more critical about their backgrounds by acquiring basic academic skills in a theoretical framework the children learn how to analyse their own local situation addressing not only immediate issues housing conditions family life community dynamics but also historical issues unlike apparently similar culturally responsive approaches to teaching underprivileged children radical local teaching explicitly uses subject matter teaching to encourage children s development in relation to their social conditions hedegaard and chaiklin detail how they developed concrete lesson plans in a radical local perspective and enumerate the accomplishments as well as the difficulties they encountered in implementing this approach

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
