an in depth look at some of the best and most influential french films of all time the cinema of france contains 24 essays each on an individual film the book features works from the silent period and poetic realism through the stylistic developments of the new wave and up to more contemporary challenging films from directors such as abel gance jean renoir marcel carné françois truffaut jean luc godard alain resnais agnès varda and luc besson set in chronological order the cinema of france provides an illuminating history of this essential national cinema and includes in depth studies of films such as un chien andalou 1929 les vacances de monsieur hulo 1953 le samouraï 1967 shoah 1985 jean de florette 1986 les visiteurs 1993 and la haine 1995

this extensive bibliography and reference guide is an invaluable resource for researchers practitioners students and anyone with an interest in canadian film and video with over 24 500 entries of which 10 500 are annotated it opens up the literature devoted to canadian film and video at last making it readily accessible to scholars and researchers drawing on both english and french sources it identifies books catalogues government reports theses and periodical and newspaper articles from canadian and non canadian publications from the first decade of the twentieth century to 1989 the work is bilingual descriptive annotations are presented in the language s of the original publication canadian film and video film et vidéo canadiens provides an in depth guide to the work of over 4000 individuals working in film and video and 5000 films and videos the entries in volume i cover topics such as film types the role of government laws and legislation censorship festivals and awards production and distribution companies education cinema buildings women and film and video art a major section covers filmmakers video artists cinematographers actors producers and various other film people volume ii presents an

author index a film and video title index and a name and subject index in the tradition of the highly acclaimed publication art and architecture in canada these volumes fill a long standing need for a comprehensive reference tool for canadian film and video this bibliography guides and supports the work of film historians and practitioners media librarians and visual curators students and researchers and members of the general public with an interest in film and video

the recent centenary of the motion picture prompted the belgian royal film archive to compile an encyclopedia of the history of belgian film the country has produced a considerable cinematic output over the past hundred years with a total of some 1 500 titles including every imaginable genre from documentaries to war films romantic dramas slapstick animation art movies and experimental films this book is published in collaboration with the royal film archive the book contains a broad survey of 100 years of belgian cinema history from masterpieces of silent filmmaking to recent highlights like the 1992 film daens this comprehensive easy to use and attractively illustrated reference work is an important scholarly addition to all serious film libraries

defining cinema is the first book to bring together leading theorists and scholars to discuss the importance of film theory to cinema studies peter lehman introduces the volume by explaining what constitutes film theory and outlining the major positions within the field by placing these five theorists and their work within a historical perspective andre bazin and siegfried kracauer represent realist film theories and sergei eisenstein represents a formalist position noel burch and christian metz are contemporary theorists who have moved beyond the classical realist formalist opposition burch s theory encompasses films and styles praised by both bazin and eisenstein and metz helped bring semiotics and psychoanalytic theory to prominence in the field

essays on quebec cinema weaves together the reflections of filmmakers and scholars from canada the united states and great britain as they move to a fresh assessment of one of the most dynamic film industries in the western hemisphere

to the french the cinema is an art form at their best they have established cinema verite mastered literary filmmaking and film noir invented the new wave and produced such unique and unclassified geniuses as truffaut and tati from les enfants du

paradis children of paradise which was made in the shadows of the occupation and opened as the allies liberated paris to such modern films as les nuits fauves savage nights the first major cinematic treatment of aids the 400 films here reflect the broad range of french filmmaking organized by french title with see references from english and alternate titles each entry includes year of release cast and production credits running time and an essay blending plot synopsis and critical commentary all fully indexed

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
