mastery of craft depends on repetition the more opportunities student actors have to be guided through analyzing scripts the more likely they are to develop a reliable process for making choices when the time comes to work independently that s why acting on

the script contains eight short plays which can be used independently or as parts of one full length play giving aspiring actors the practice they need to tell the story of the play and of their characters clearly believably and compellingly with each new scene readers are given the opportunity to think through the analysis and synthesis process independently then they are guided clearly through that process the first section reintroduces the basic elements of acting craft the book then lays out how these elements relate to a script in general and then more specifically by using a short play to illustrate the basic principles the second section focuses on specific analysis and synthesis problems using original scenes especially composed to help students develop their analysis and choice making skills and to address individual acting issues the plays already tested in classes and two productions one professional and one college are filled with the kinds of acting problems that beginning actors often have trouble with and need to learn to solve in addition specific problems that actors might have with certain types of material are addressed as well

an actor's script is both a gold mine and the map to discovering it if properly read a script will reveal its riches to you unfortunately most actors never learn to efficiently read the map or master how to convert what they find in a script into playable gold why because this aspect of the acting process is seldom taught in a simple and tangible way in the classroom or studio acting can and should be more than guesswork and instinct actor's alchemy finding the gold in your script examines the relationship between the script and what an actor ultimately does on the stage or on screen here is a straightforward guide filled with useful information to help actors learn to use their scripts in a specific and analytical way to solve the problems of the scene and bring their elusive characters to life in learning how to decipher the script actors will be equipped to make the choices that lead to delivering a gold

performance

for most of the postcolonial era the aymara indians of highland bolivia were a group without representation in national politics believing that their cause would finally be recognized the aymara fought alongside the victorious liberals during the civil war of 1899 despite aymara loyalty liberals quickly moved to marginalize them after the war in her groundbreaking study e gabrielle kuenzli revisits the events of the civil war and its aftermath to dispel popular myths about the aymara and reveal their forgotten role in the nation building project of modern bolivia kuenzli examines documents from the famous postwar pe as trial to recover aymara testimony during what essentially became a witch hunt she reveals that the aymara served as both dutiful plaintiffs allied with liberals and unwitting defendants charged with wartime atrocities and instigating a race war to further combat their indian problem creole liberals developed a public discourse that positioned the inca as the only indians worthy of national inclusion this was justified by the incas high civilization and reputation as noble conquerors along with their current non threatening nature the whitening of incans was a thinly veiled attempt to block the aymara from politics while also consolidating the power of the liberal party kuenzli posits that despite their repression the aymara did not stagnate as an idle apolitical body after the civil war she demonstrates how the aymara appropriated the liberal s indian discourse by creating theatrical productions that glorified incan elements of the aymara past in this way the aymara were able to carve an acceptable space as progressive indians in society kuenzli provides an extensive case study of an inca play created in the aymara town of caracollo which proved highly popular and helped to unify the aymara as her study shows the amyara engaged liberal creoles in a variety of ways at the start of the twentieth

century shaping national discourse and identity in a tradition of activism that continues to this day

the actor's script offers a clear concise and easily assimilated technique for beginning scriptwork specifically tailored to actor's requirements and sensibilities

reading the right text introduces six new plays from contemporary china five of which are translated here into english for the first time chosen from a wide variety of well received dramas of the period each play represents the traditions and changes in a particular subgenre regional theater proletarian theater women's theater history plays and experimental theater xiaomei chen's wide ranging and perceptive introduction locates the plays in the political and cultural history of modern china to demonstrate the interrelationship between theater history society and everyday experience she highlights the origin and development of the different sub genres and outlines critical approaches from numerous fields including gender studies performance studies subaltern studies and comparative cultural studies quite apart from their importance as theater these plays are crucial for a fully rounded understanding of the cultural dynamics involved in the transition from maoist to post mao china from socialist realist drama to the post socialist response to a market economy and a society in flux

Jewish drama and theatre has followed a tortuous path from extreme rabbinical intolerance to eventual secular liberalism with its openness to the heritages of both Judaism as a culture and prominent foreign cultures to the extent of multicultural integration no wonder therefore that since biblical times until the seventeenth century there are only examples of tangential theatre practices this initial intolerance shared by the church was rooted in pagan connotations of theatre rather than in the neutral nature of the theatre medium capable of formulating and communicating contrasting thoughts whereas by the tenth century the church understood that theatre could be harnessed to its own ends Jewish theatre was only created seven centuries later through spontaneous and amateurish theatrical practices such as the Yiddish Purim Shpil and the Purim Rabbi due to their carnivalesque and cathartic nature these practices were tolerated by the rabbinical establishment albeit only during the Purim holiday but as a result Jewish drama and theatre were created and emerged despite rabbinical antagonism under the influence of the Jewish enlightenment Yiddish speaking theatres were increasingly established a trend that became central in the cultural enterprise of the Jews in Israel this process involved a renewed use of Hebrew as a spoken language and the transition from a profound religious identity to a secular Jewish one characterised by a basic liberalism to the extent of openness to cultures traditionally perceived as archetypal enemies of Judaism this book sets out to analyse play scripts and performance texts produced in the Israeli theatre in order to illustrate these trends and concludes that only a liberal society can bring about the full realisation of theatre's potentialities
